SOLID WASTE

Sec. 98-1. - Definitions.

The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this chapter, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

Rubbish means solid and ordinary waste, other than garbage, accumulated by family residents, including glass and broken wire, discarded clothing, trash, tin cans, bottles, papers and tree limbs, grass and weed cuttings properly contained or bundled as prescribed in this chapter.

Solid waste means all putrescible and nonputrescible refuse in solid or semisolid form including, but not limited to, garbage, rubbish, ashes or incinerator residue, street refuse, dead animals, demolition wastes, construction wastes, solid or semisolid commercial and industrial wastes including explosives, biomedical wastes, chemical wastes, herbicide and pesticide wastes. The term "solid waste" shall not include:

- (1) Scrap materials which are source separated for collection and processing as industrial raw materials, except when contained in the waste collected by or in behalf of a solid waste management system; or
- (2) Used motor oil, which shall not be considered to be a solid waste, but shall be considered a deleterious substance, if the used motor oil is recycled for energy reclamation and is ultimately destroyed when recycled.

Sec. 98-2. - Duty to request and use city's collection service.

To assist in maintaining the general sanitation and health of the city, it shall be the duty of every person occupying or having control of the occupancy of any premises located on a regularly established solid waste route to notify the city clerk at the beginning of such occupancy and request, accept and use the solid waste pickup and collection service; provided, however, that failure of any owner, rental agent or occupant of such premises to make such request shall not prevent or in any way impair or impede the department of public works from adding the address of such premises to the proper collection route records and providing such service and otherwise enforcing by appropriate action the regulatory measures prescribed in this chapter and causing the fees or charges therefor to be paid.

Sec. 98-3. - Private hauling of garbage and rubbish prohibited; exception.

- (a) It shall be unlawful for any person not under contract with the city to haul any solid waste over the city streets; provided, however, that nothing in this section shall be construed to preclude a person from removing rubbish from his own premises, at his own expense, and hauling the same over city streets, provided it is done in a neat and sanitary manner.
- (b) In addition to the provisions of subsection (a) of this section, any private commercial hauler of solid waste may provide disposal services and may haul solid waste over city streets for commercial or other miscellaneous establishments utilizing or requiring garbage service for the disposal of more than 300 cubic yards of solid waste per month; provided, however:

Sec. 98-4. - Littering prohibited; general container requirements.

- (a) No person shall throw, sweep, deposit or place any solid waste in any alley, street or other public place within the city, nor shall any person deposit or place it upon private property, whether owned by such person or not, within the limits of the city, unless the same is enclosed in a suitable container.
- (b) Containers referred to in subsection (a) of this section shall be 90-gallon plastic carts or one-, two-, or three-yard dumpsters on wheels. Such carts, or dumpsters, and the grounds immediately around the same will be kept in a safe and sanitary condition at all times.
- (c) One plastic cart will be furnished to each residence and to each small business establishment having a low enough volume of solid waste that it can be accommodated in one 90-gallon cart.
- (d) Any resident or business establishment may purchase additional carts at the cost of such carts to the city.
